This course is intended for overseas teachers of English who want to improve their mastery of English while studying new and cutting edge language teaching methodologies.

- Study for one or two weeks
- Maximum class size: 14 participants
- Minimum age: 20
- Minimum level: Higher Intermediate or equivalent and above (CEFR B2)
- 24 lessons per week

Course Content

This course will help participants develop professionally as teachers by exploring their own teaching experience and developing new ideas. It will cover the latest approaches in the English Language Teaching world and participants will look at how these approaches can be implemented in their own teaching context. Participants will explore a variety of teaching methodologies and classroom activities with a theoretical and practical focus, which will include having the opportunity to observe WSE teachers and reflect on those observations with their trainer. They will also take part in reflective practice and workshop activities, in order to gather a bank of practical ideas and activities to which can be adapted to their own class and style.

Participants will also refresh and analyse their own knowledge of English language and usage. Lessons will focus on various themes and will improve participants' pronunciation and use of a range of English structures.
